Are Our Prayers Predestined?

A seminary professor challenged his students to consider the impact of their prayers. If God is the sovereign author of all matters, then can “my” prayers ever be really mine? On the other hand, our interpersonal and interacting God has revealed His desire for engagement, a sort of divine give-and-take between the Ruler of the Universe and us, His beloved children. So perhaps we do play a part? Perhaps we do bring something distinctly of ourselves to the relationship?

Psalm 139 testifies to King David's acknowledgement of our Lord's overarching power: “Thou hast searched me and known me. Thou knowest when I sit down and when I rise up; Thou discernest my thoughts from afar.” And later, “Even before a word is on my tongue, lo, O Lord, thou knowest it altogether.” We imagine the shepherd David in his adolescent years, alone with the flock, puzzling over the philosophical questions of a life lived before Jehovah God, plucking his instrument and setting his questions to a musical lyric.

Presbyterians Protecting Life takes up the task of prayerfully seeking the Lord's perfect will for a variety of people and situations. Often notable are the crises of unplanned pregnancies startling people's expectations for their days and years ahead. Other crises involve complicated pregnancies for which doctors have delivered discouraging news and parents are faced with agonizing decisions. Yet we champion life for all ages and a variety of situations – some of which you will sense in the prayer prompts offered here in this edition of our Life Support Prayer Calendar.

Please join us in seeking the very best for your nearby neighbors and for people you don't even know. We do not offer pat answers. Like David, we are committed to relationship with God while also filled with questions about how He wants to use us. We simply share ourselves in prayer, compelled by Christ's gospel, calling out to the One whose omniscience is too high, too wonderful for any of us to fully comprehend.

JANUARY

Dec. 29-Jan. 4: God comes first

LORD, I confess that I have often ignored You, putting my desires above Yours, and that I have put my comfort before the needs of all those whom You have created in Your image. (1 John 1:9)

Holy God, I resolve to put You first. Please forgive my sins of both omission and commission; may the Holy Spirit and Christ restore me and my joy.

(Exodus 20:3, Rom 12:1-2, 1 John 1:8-10, 1 Cor 6:11)

Jan. 5-11: We belong to God from conception

Lord, as You revealed Christ to the Magi, we pray that parents today recognize Your image in their children from their conception, through their birth, childhood, and adolescence, and fulfill their roles as protectors of the children You have given them. (Mt 2:1-11, Gen 1:27)

May parents be enabled to fulfill their baptismal vows to teach their children the Christian faith ("to raise their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord").

(Deuteronomy 6:6-7)

Jan. 12-18: Pray for children leaving home

Our loving Father, please surround our high school graduates with your love and protection as they leave their parents and need Your wisdom to make good choices. (1 Kings 3:3-12, Proverbs 16:9)

We pray that our children may seek and find a godly spouse, one who will love them with a self-sacrificial love and encourage them in the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

(Gal 5:22-23)

Jan. 19-25: Pray for government leaders

Lord, we pray for those in authority, whether or not we voted for them; and we pray for those appointed, or otherwise assuming public office, that they may do Your will. Please help us discern when we must obey them and when obeying You means that we must disobey them. (Rom 13:1-2, Acts 4:18-20)

Lord, may all those in authority open their hearts and minds to Your wisdom and have the courage to stand up against those opposed to Your good will.

(1 Tim 2:1-4)

Jan. 26-Feb. 1: Prayers for youth

Lord, we pray for our youth who are surrounded by a culture that denies their value, leading them to seek love and acceptance in the wrong places. (Continued above)

FEBRUARY

Jan. 26-Feb. 1: Prayers for youth (Continued)

Lead them to know You and of Your plans for them.

(Rom 12:1-2, 1 Cor 10:13, 1 Cor 6:18-20)

We pray that You give young people the courage and strength to stand for what is right, whether contrary voices of the Evil One come from peers or from adults. May Christ surround them on all sides.

(Joshua 1:7-9, James 4:7)

Feb. 2-8: Pregnancy Resource/Care Centers

We pray for pregnancy resource centers who show God's love for all children; protect and provide for them. Help them to "not grow weary of doing good." (James 1:27, Gal 6:9)

Lord, may pregnancy resource centers protect those for whom others wish/plan harm. **(Prov 24:11, Mal 4:5-6)**

Feb. 9-15: Love: True love wants the best for the other and is self-sacrificing and requires self-control

We pray for husbands to love their wives as Christ loved them and loves the Church. (Eph 5:2,25)

Holy God, may we all exercise self-control and seek Your provided way of escape from temptation.

(2 Tim 1:7; Titus 2:12, 1 Cor 10:13)

Feb. 16-22: Abusive relationships

Many children who were raised in abusive relationships in turn seek abusers or become abusers as adults. We pray for parents to be godly examples for their children. (Eph 6:4)

Lord, we ask your ongoing help to overcome evil with good. **(Rom 12:9-21)**

Feb. 23-Mar. 1: The elderly and those with infirmities

We pray for your lovingkindness for those caring for older parents and family members. (Ruth 1-4)

Sovereign Lord, prompt dependence upon You for those ministering to others with disabilities. We pray for patience for those who are dependent upon the care of others, too.

(Isaiah 43:3; 2 Sam 4:4, 9:1-10)

MARCH

Mar. 2-8: Pregnant mothers

Almighty God, You inhabit eternity and are infinitely holy, and yet You are also with him who has a contrite and humble spirit. Please give women who are pregnant a willing spirit to carry to term and nurture their baby developing in the womb. (Isa 57:15)

Give women healthy pregnancies, safe deliveries, beloved babies, and considerate husbands.

Mar. 9-15: Giver of Salvation

(Psalm 46:1; Jonah 2:9; Rom 10:13)

O God, our "refuge and strength and very present help in trouble," to you belongs salvation. We lift to You those men and women who are overwhelmed with problems in their life circumstances and filled with despair.

Help them to repent of their sins and call on You for mercy. Let them know your forgiving love and bring them to saving faith in Jesus. Comfort all who sorrow.

Mar. 16-22: Adoption

(Gal 4:4-7; John 1:12; Rom 8:17)

Gracious Heavenly Father, we praise you for sending Jesus into the world as fully human, yet fully God, so that he by his substitutionary penal atonement allows us to be regenerated and adopted as your beloved children. Create in many a willingness to adopt orphaned and abandoned children, of all ages and races.

Give us all the necessary resources to raise our children in the nurture and admonition of our Lord Jesus.

Mar. 23-29: Long-Term Care facilities

(Lev 19:32; Ps 71:9; 1 Tim 5:4-8)

O God, you have stamped your image into every human person and called your people to care for everyone without regard to their age or abilities. We pray for those who live out their final years in skilled nursing and long-term care facilities.

Give them compassionate caregivers and visitors, who will share with them the Hope of the Risen Christ.

Mar. 30-Apr. 5: Bringing Good out of Evil

(Gen 50:20; Heb 12:11; 1 John 1:9; 2 Cor 5:17)

O Sovereign Lord, Judge of all the Earth and Avenger of all injustice, we praise you for your victory over sin and evil demonstrated powerfully in leading Jesus through the suffering of his crucifixion to glorious resurrection. Give those mothers whose babies may have been conceived in rape healing of that terrible trauma. (Continued above)

APRIL

Mar. 30-Apr. 5: Bringing Good out of Evil (Continued)

Help such moms to understand their unborn child is an innocent human person worthy of protection and love.

Apr. 6-12: Pastors and Abortion/Euthanasia

(Gen 1:26-28; James 3:8-9; Matthew 5:21)

O God, Creator and Giver of life, thank you for uniquely making humankind in your image and highly valuing every person. Holy Spirit, help pastors preach and teach the biblical view of human life and your command not to shed innocent blood.

Lord, give pastors courage to call abortion/euthanasia a grave sin and the wisdom to lift up the hope of Your complete forgiveness because of Jesus Christ.

Apr. 13-19: Hosanna, Loud Hosanna

(Matthew 25:1-17; Philippians 2:5-11)

Almighty God, your Son our Lord came as a humble King who rightly received the praise of children--"All glory, laud, and honor to Thee, Redeemer King//To whom the lips of children made sweet hosannas ring!"

Holy Spirit, may we gladly receive infants and children into our church worship services and teach them to praise our Lord and Savior Jesus in every season.

Apr. 20-26: Resurrection Life

(Isa 25:6-9; 1 Cor 15:19-26)

We worship You, Risen Christ, for You in truth have been raised from the dead! Help us to see that if Christ has been raised then there is no obstacle, problem, or trial for which God will not give us the strength to face and overcome.

Holy Spirit, encourage us by our Lord's resurrection as we face hostile opposition in our post-Christian, post-conservative, self-exalting culture to upholding and defending the right to life of all human persons.

Apr. 27-May 3: God's Justice

(Isaiah 26:21; Matthew 25:31-46)

Praise you, O God, for you have fixed a day on which you will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom you have appointed; and of this you have given full assurance to all by raising him from the dead (Acts 17:31).

Holy God, awaken people to repent of their sins and turn to Jesus in obedient faith. Thank you that ruthless oppression and murderous violence against your image-bearers will be judged and silenced forever.
